



# UEFA Champions League 2022

## Fan Information -Inter Milan V Liverpool Football Club February 16th 2022 – 21:00 KO Stadium “San Siro” – Milano

Liverpool Football Club appreciates the dedication and loyalty of our travelling fans. In this document you'll find some general advice and information which you may find helpful when planning your trip.

### Important Information:

- Entry to the stadium is now only permitted by showing NHS COVID Vaccination travel pass. This applies to all fans from the age of 12 upwards as per Italian laws. **From 1st February you must have had your final vaccine within 180 days (6 months) for your vaccination certificate to be valid to enter Italy and the stadium.**
- Kick-off is at 21:00hrs local time (20:00hrs GMT). Turnstiles will open at 18:30 CET (two hours before kick-off). Italy is one hour ahead of the UK (+1 BST).
- Liverpool FC seats are allocated third green tier Blocks 301-318 Liverpool FC supporters will enter the stadium via access gate 10.
- Fans must always be in possession of photographic ID. It will only be checked at the stadium if individuals come to the attention of the authorities due to conduct.
- Fans are urged to arrive early at the stadium. There will be an enhanced searching in operation and three ticket check points at the stadium where body searches (pat-downs) will be conducted.
- Supporters without tickets are therefore urged not to travel to the game as the match is a sell-out.
- Flags/Banners – all banners would require to be seen by the Milan operation ahead of the game. Please share with [slo@liverpoolfc.com](mailto:slo@liverpoolfc.com) ahead of the game. If you've submitted this at the last match in Milan, you don't need to resubmit.

### Covid Restrictions:

The current Foreign Commonwealth Development Office advice for travelling to Italy states that, if fully vaccinated with a vaccination approved for use in the EU, then exemptions from quarantine on arrival apply.

However, evidence of the COVID-19 vaccination must be produced at the border and 14 days must also have passed since the final dose.

A Passenger Locator Form and proof of a negative test less than 48hrs prior to arrival must also be produced. Supporters are reminded to follow the most up to date travel advice via <https://www.gov.uk/foreign-travel-advice/italy>

Italy operates a 'Green Pass' for entry into bars and restaurants, for use on public transport and entering sporting and entertainment venues. The NHS Covid travel pass will be accepted for visiting supporters wishing to frequent such places and for entry to the stadium.

A 'green pass' proof of double vaccination and it is the second date that is checked. Entry to the stadium is now only permitted by showing NHS COVID Vaccination travel pass. <https://www.dgc.gov.it/web/checose.html>

Mask wearing inside the stadium is mandatory.

**Note; From 1st February you must have had your final vaccine within 180 days for your vaccination certificate to be valid to enter Italy and the stadium. Rules have changed from the 1<sup>st</sup> Feb so please ensure you familiarise yourself with the links below:**

#### **Fan Meeting Point:**

- Visiting Supporters tend to congregate at the Piazza Duomo, a large square located in front of the famous Cathedral and in Arco della pace in piazza Sempione Piazza Sempione, 20154 Milano MI, Italy (6km from stadium)

#### **Getting to the Stadium:**

- Inter Milan and local police authorities suggest that the quickest and most efficient mode of transport for away supporters is the M1 RED LINE TUBE / SUBWAY
- Milan has four Metro lines serving the city. Previously the closest station to the stadium was Lotto on the Metropolitan Linea M1 (Red line). The newer purple or violet (M5) line has its own San Siro station and visiting supporters are advised to use this stop.
- Fans arriving must turn left at the top of the stairs and left again outside the station and proceed away from stadium before turning right to access the stadium. The lighting in these areas is poor and the signage minimal.
- The Police strongly encourage visiting supporters to utilise the Purple (M5) Line as opposed to the overground tram system and thereby avoid any potential conflict at the tram stop and Gate 14 where the home supporters are. It is important that the suggested route is followed once you come out of the station.  
On the way back, the same route should be followed. The distance is a five-minute walk.



### On arrival at the stadium:

- Entry to the stadium is now only permitted by showing NHS COVID Vaccination travel pass. This applies to all fans from the age of 12 upwards as per Italian law.
- Turnstiles will open between 18:30 CET.
- Please arrive early at the stadium to allow enough time for necessary security checks and bag (A4 size) searches. No bags larger than A4 size.
- Covid vaccine status checks or proof of a negative test will also be conducted at this point.
- Refreshments in the form of both hot and cold selection drinks will be available to purchase outside the stadium as with non-alcoholic drinks.

Liverpool FC supporters will enter the stadium via access gate 10.



### Disabled supporters:

Disabled supporters and carers are admitted to viewing point in the **Orange sector (East stand)** accessed via Gate 11.

- There is a screening to prevent articles being thrown in front of the away sector
- Flags/Banners will need prior approval by the Italian police. If you've had a banner approved from the previous visit to Milan, LFC will submit on your behalf. Please send new requests by Friday 11th Feb to [slo@liverpoolfc.com](mailto:slo@liverpoolfc.com)
- Italian law requires that details of ticket holders' first & last name be registered onto a database. This enables tickets to be compared with photographic identification documents at the entry points to the stadium. Documents such as UK driving licence and Passport will be accepted.
- The stadium accepts both card and cash payments.
- Alcohol less than 5% in strength will be sold inside the stadium.
- Italian law requires that details of ticket holders' first and last name together with the date of birth be registered onto a database. This enables tickets to be compared with photographic identification documents at the entry points to the stadium. Documents such as UK driving licence and Passport will be accepted.
